Pedagogic Principles and Strategy

- Teach with an open attitude to respect and embrace the different ideas of the students.
- The level of difficulty and coverage of the teaching material should meet the multi-faceted requirements of the students offering a certain measure of challenge.
- Provide the students with a greater space and freedom of learning.
- Offer guidance to help the students to observe, to compare, to analyse and to make decision at any time during the impartation process.
- Adopt active measures to encourage the students to ask questions and help them to search for the means to solve their problems.
- Provide to the students assignments of rich creativity and deep speculation to guide the students to think, to explore diversely so as to expand the horizon of their reflection.
- Offer to the students opportunities to learn independently with self-reliance, encouraging them to perform self-evaluation so as to nourish the initiative to accomplish self-reflection.
- Provide for the students chances of co-operation, discussion and

mutual learning.

- Help the students to recognize their own talents and interests to enable them to set achievable goals.
- Educate the students the technique of social contact so that they may be caring, have respect and consideration for others.

Principles of Parents' Teaching

- Both the father and mother should hold the same attitude of teaching and set an example with their own conduct.
- Avoid expecting too much from the children but set appropriate goals in accordance with the capacity of theirs.
- Respect the children, allow them to voice out their opinion and give them chances to make their option.
- Help the children to grow into maturity by allowing them to nurture various sorts of interests.
- Encourage the children to participate in multifarious studies and to acquire fine learning habits so as to expand their sharp sense of perception.
- Inspire the children to adopt the appropriate sense of value in their everyday life and help them to distinguish the right from the wrong as well as to practise the proper social norm.
- Stimulate the children to schedule their time and make the best of every minute to acquire extra-curricular knowledge.
- Participate actively with the children all the school activities.
